General Information about COVID-19 (coronavirus)

What is it?

COVID-19 is a newly identified respiratory virus. The virus is contagious and potentially fatal. It is suspected that it is transmitted through coughing and sneezing by infected individuals. At the present time, there is no vaccine, cure, or specific treatment.

How is it spread?

Health authorities have not confirmed how COVID-19 is transmitted, but suspect it is spread person to-person. There is also evidence that the virus has been spread by animal sources, including individuals with links to seafood or animal markets. They do not believe you can get it from air, water or food.

What are the signs and symptoms?

Individuals infected with COVID-19 have displayed the following symptoms:

- Mild to severe respiratory illness
- Fever
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing

How can I protect myself?

Because there is currently no vaccine to prevent infection, the best way to protect yourself is to avoid being exposed to this virus. The WHO and CDC recommend the following additional steps:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol if soap and water are not available
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Stay home when you are sick
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces

What happens if I suspect I or someone I know has it?

If you exhibit symptoms of coronavirus within two weeks of traveling to a known affected region, you should contact a health care professional and mention your recent travel. If you have had close contact with someone exhibiting coronavirus symptoms who has recently traveled from a highly affected area, you should call ahead to a health care professional and mention your close contact and the person's recent travel. Your health care professional will work with your country, provincial or state's public health department to determine if you need to be tested.

Are your staff able to work remotely?

We are instructing our employees to work from home where possible and only come into the office if necessary. During this temporary arrangement, we are open for business and committed to fulfilling our responsibilities to our clients. How are you planning to maintain operations day-to-day?

How are you communicating in your buildings?

We are, where we are responsible, placing sanitizer and notices in offices to encourage proper hand washing, as this also assists with the annual common cold and flu infections. All guidance being provided is in accordance with the measures suggested by global and national leading health organizations.

Additionally, we are communicating directly with building ownership and tenants on our response and action plans for their locations.
