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Updated Policy Framework

Our group's ESG policy was amended for 2020 to include certain social and governance items not previously covered by our policy. Avison Young Investment Management has also added a new Responsible Investment Policy, Diversity & Inclusion Policy and set specific performance targets for reaching net zero by 2040 which is outlined in our Capital Investment & Targets Policy.



Nashville Rebuild

Our multifamily building in Nashville was hit by a tornado in March of 2020 which caused damage to all apartments in the 242-unit complex. As with other multifamily rebuilds in our portfolio, the property is being rebuilt using all energy star and low flow appliances with new energy metering to help us reduce consumption over time. Units now include smart thermostats, all LED lighting, and the exterior landscaping has added more draught and heat tolerant plant species to help with climate resilience.



Day of Giving

Like so many things in 2020, Avison Young's annual dAY of giving looked a bit different this year given the impacts of the pandemic on travel and the ability to meet and interact in person. In response to these limitations, our annual dAY of Giving was dedicated to combating racial injustice through education of our employees at a global level. On October 15th Avison Young held an internal learning, listening and action seminar designed to support our Diversity & Inclusion strategy and to help all of us better understand how we can create healthier, more inclusive communities.



Consumption Data Verification







PRI Signatory


